There will be no premiums or prize monies awarded. ADGA rosettes will be awarded for Grand Champion, Reserve Grand Champion, Best of Breed in each breed and Best in Show.

**NOTICE: The Senior Doe & the Junior Doe shows are sanctioned separately. The Senior Bucks & the Junior Bucks are Combined into one show & are not sanctioned separately**

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

*The AMERICAN DAIRY GOAT ASSOCIATION rules shall govern.*

### 1. ENTRY FEES:

Entry fees are as follows for 3- ring Senior Doe, Junior Doe or Sr/Jr Combined Buck Shows

Showman entries on or before April 22, 2022.....\$ 18.00 per entry

Pens –pen request by April 21, 2022(see below).....\$15 per pen

Late entry/ day of show (max 5 entries).....\$28.00 per entry

**Payment in full (entry fees and pen fees) must accompany all entries!!!**

"NO REFUNDS-NO CREDITS-NO EXCEPTIONS". A maximum of 5 substitutions will be allowed at check in time. Late fees may be waived at the discretion of the show committee.

### 2. ARRIVAL AND VET CHECK:

**Early arrival** will begin Friday, April 22nd, 2022 at 6 PM until 8 PM. Please notify **Lori Anderson 352-449-0203** or email her **info@doelake.com** if you plan on arriving Friday. **The vet will be there from 6:00 PM-8 PM.**

**Regular arrival** - Saturday, April 23rd, 2022 will be from 6:00 AM-8:00 AM. The vet will be there from 6:00 - 8:00 AM. The show will start promptly with Senior does at 9 AM.

**Regular arrival** - Sunday April 24th, 2022 from 7:30 A.M to 9 AM. The vet will be there from 7:30 - 9:00 AM. The show will start promptly at 9:30 AM.

An accredited veterinarian will be checking animals **BEFORE** they are **UNLOADED** and allowed into the barn/show arena between the vet hours listed above. You may come and set up your pens/tack in the barn prior to the vet check.

### 3. CAMPING HOOKUP

*Camping hookups (power and water) are available for \$35 a night paid directly to KVLS. The hookups are 50 AMP, so if you need to supply a converter for a smaller amp requirements. Spaces are limited so please fill out the camping form located here to reserve your spot.*

### 4. REGISTRATION CHECK IN:

Check in schedule for registration of animals is as follows:

**Early check-in: Friday, April 22, 2022: 6 PM until 9 PM**

**Check-in by phone: April 22, 2022: 6pm until 9pm (see below for details)**

**Regular check-in: Saturday, April 23, 2022: 6 AM until 8:00 AM**

**Buck check-in: Sunday, April 24, 2022: 7:30 AM until 9:00 AM**

A maximum of 5 substitutions will be allowed at check in (a change in class is not considered a substitution).

**IT IS THE EXHIBITORS RESPONSIBILITY TO MAKE SURE HIS/HER ANIMALS ARE CHECKED-IN BEFORE THE BOOKS CLOSE AT THE TIMES LISTED ABOVE, NO CHANGES WILL BE MADE AFTER THAT TIME (except at discretion of show committee)**

## **Check-in by Phone:**

Please consider check-in via phone the night before the show. We tried it for the first time in 2021 and it work very well. I really cuts down on check-in lines the morning of the show and helps us start the show on time!! There is a place on the bottom left of entry form to mark with your phone number as there will be on the online entry. Make sure to include a valid/working phone number that we can contact you at during the checking times. Someone will call you between 6PM and 9:30 PM to do your registration via the phone. Please make sure that you will for sure be attending the show the next morning.

**YOU MUST still go through VET CHECK-IN at arrival before you unload your animals. This is for show registration only.**

\*\*\*\* Please note it is YOUR responsibility to go to regular check-in the next morning for any substitutions/changes that occur after phone registration is complete to get it corrected BEFORE the show. No changes will be allowed after check-in is complete.

Phone check-in will be available on a first come first serve basis. We will do our best to get to everyone, but it will depend on the number of requests. If we are not able accommodate all requests, or we are unable to reach you at the number provided when we call, you will need to plan to use the regular registration check-in the morning of the show.

### **5. PENS:**

Pens will be assigned this year on a first come/first serve basis for completed entries only (all fees paid in full). Exhibitors are required to bring their own bedding, or you can purchase shavings that will be onsite when you arrive. You must remove any trash or non-bedding debris before they leave. Pen cleanout and break down are included. We apologize that this is necessary, but due to issues encountered this past year it has become necessary.

### **SHOW ATTIRE FOR OPEN SHOW: Proper Showmanship attire is required for Showmanship classes!**

White, black or khaki pants/shorts (mid-thigh or longer)/capris/skirts/skorts and clean, plain white collar shirt or 2022 show t-shirts are required for open show. Herd logos or pin striping on collar/sleeve is acceptable. No short shorts, cut offs, tank tops, swimsuits or yoga pants are allowed for show attire. Closed toed shoes or boots are required, and hats or caps are not allowed in the show ring. Exhibitors not conforming to the dress code will not be allowed to enter the ring.

### **6. JUDGING:**

Judging will begin at 9:00 AM on Saturday, April 23rd, 2022 starting with Sr. Doe Show then followed by Youth Showmanship, and conclude with the Jr. Doe Show.

Sunday, April 24th, 2022 will be the Sr/Jr Combined Buck show. Judging will begin at 9:30 AM on Sunday.

The judges and their secretaries will begin in the rings listed below and move to the next ring as judging ends. When judging of a breed is completed, the animals will remain in the ring or at ring side, and the judge and secretary will move to the next ring.

### **7. Rings and show order:**

Each breed will show in one ring for all shows; judges and secretaries will move.

1. **The Senior and Junior doe shows are separately sanctioned.** The breeds sanctioned are: A=Alpines, L=Lamanchas, ND=Nigerian Dwarfs, N=Nubians, RG=Recorded Grades. AOP= all other purebreds.
2. The Senior Doe Show will start with LaManchas, Nigerians, and Nubians in their respective rings.
3. The Junior Doe Show will start with LaManchas, Nigerians, and Nubians in their respective rings.

**The Senior and Junior Bucks are a combined show.** The breeds sanctioned are, L=Lamanchas, ND=Nigerian Dwarfs N=Nubians, Alpine and AOP=AOP (A= Oberhasli, Saanen, Sable, Toggenburg). The Buck Show will start with Nubians and Nigerians LaManchas, in their respective rings.

**To keep the show progressing in a timely manner, the show committee reserves the right to change the show order or ring assignment.** Exhibitors with more than one breed need to be prepared to have additional handlers or to rely on the Show Committee to provide handlers so that classes are not delayed.

*\*\*The order of the show may be subject to change by the Show Committee at the request of exhibitors Showing multiple breeds or in the event of unforeseen circumstances. \*\**

## 8. HEALTH RULES:

All goats must have a certificate of veterinary inspection and a scrapie premise number (call 352-333-3120 or visit [www.aphis.usda.gov/vs/scrapie](http://www.aphis.usda.gov/vs/scrapie) for information). A health certificate current within 90 days for goats originating in the State of Florida or 30 days for goats originating from out of state. Goats originating in the State of Florida no longer require testing for tuberculosis or brucellosis. Goats originating from out of state must have been tested for tuberculosis and brucellosis within 90 days of the show.

## **9. LIABILITY FOR LOSS OR THEFT**

The owner or custodian of property of any kind brought to the Fairgrounds; either for exhibit or for other purposes, assumes as a condition of its admission to the grounds, all risk and/or responsibility for its loss, damage or theft.

The Spring Fling Dairy Goat Show committee, its officers, members and volunteers will not be held responsible or have any liability for any damage, injury or death resulting from theft, fire, the elements, accidents or other conditions or causes; whether to exhibitors, animals, property of exhibitor, vehicles on the grounds and articles left therein or any other property of any nature whatsoever.

### **GENERAL:**

The American Dairy Goat Association registration certificate is required on all animals 6 months of age or older. A duplicate application for registry stamped by the ADGA office is permissible for animals under 6 months of age. The registration or stamped duplicate application must be available to the show secretary at the time of arrival.

All dairy goats must be dehorned, disbudded, or naturally polled.

### **Dogs are not allowed at the show.**

The show chairperson will designate where to dump milk at check-in. No awards will be given to any animal in any class, if in the opinion of the judge said animal does not meet breed standards.

Over-uddering of dairy goats is frowned upon. The judge shall have the authority to excuse animals from the ring for removal of excess milk.

It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to properly feed, water, milk, and care for their animals. Failure to do so will result in exhibitor's immediate expulsion from the premises.

\*\*\*NO BODY CLIPPING IN THE BARN\*\*\*

*Please make sure your animals are correctly tattooed. Failure to do so makes your dairy goat ineligible to receive credit for their win.*

The Show Committee shall have the authority to expel any exhibitor or any in their company for failure to abide by these rules contained herein, or for unacceptable conduct. The exhibitor and/or any in their company will also be prohibited from showing at this venue the following year. By application for admission, each exhibitor and any in their company agree that they have read, understood, and will abide by these rules. (including the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and items within the "Health Regulations" section of the General Rules).

## **12. RELEASE:**

**Please leave the grounds as you found them. All debris and trash must be removed and put into designated containers. Clean out of pen bedding and pen break down is included in pen fee. However, if you setup your own tailgate pens you must also remove and dispose of all bedding as well as debris.**

Dairy goats and exhibitors will be released following the last class in which you are showing, **unless you must remain for Best in Show.**
